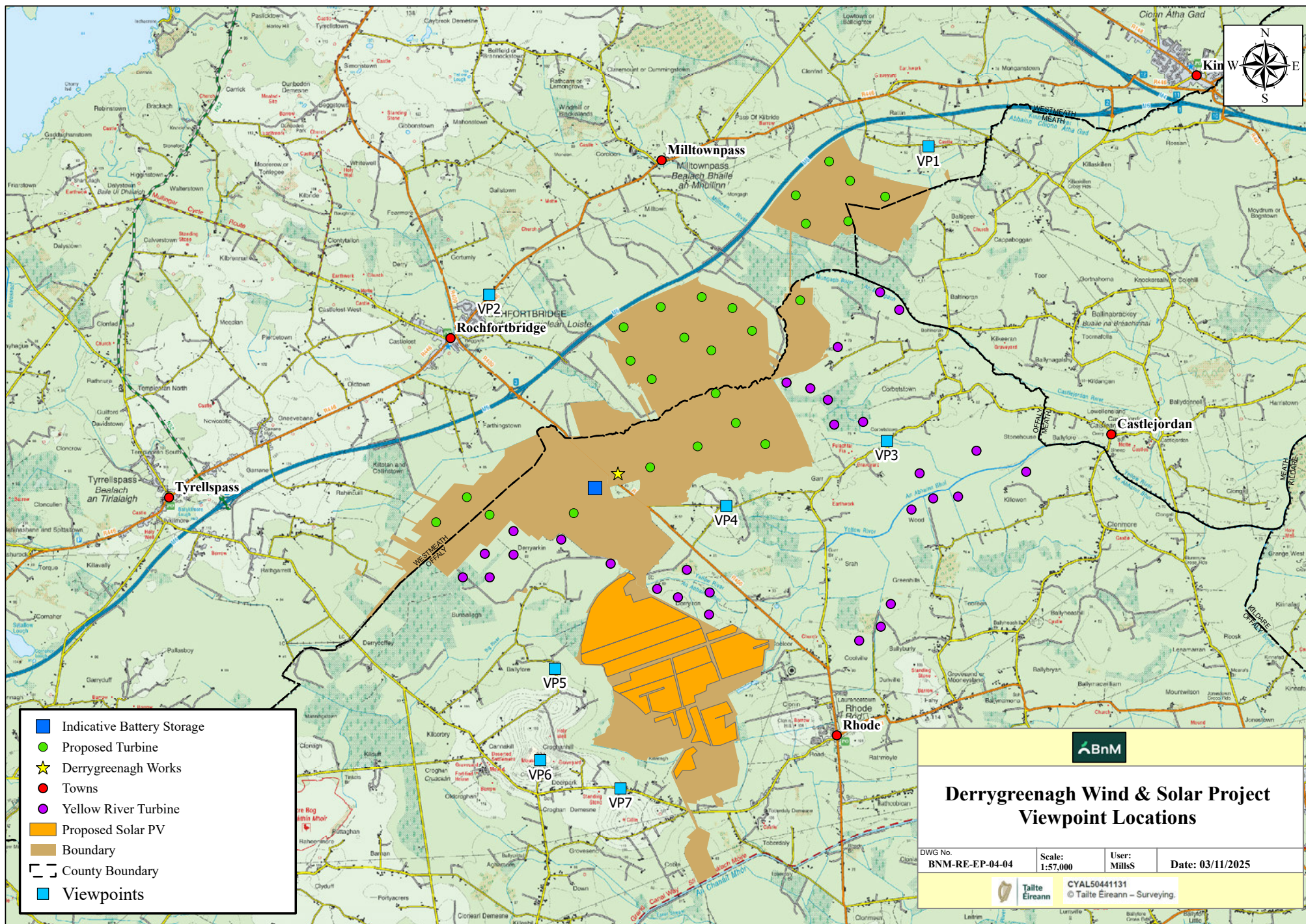
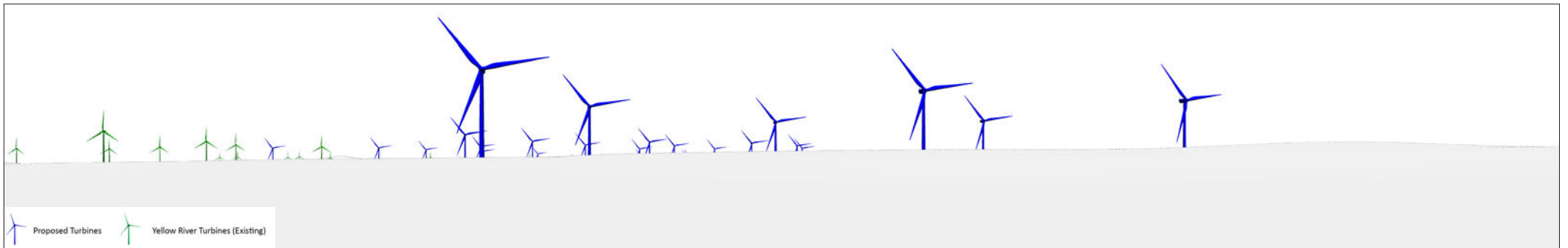


Photomontage Booklet for Proposed Derrygreenagh Wind and Solar Energy Project

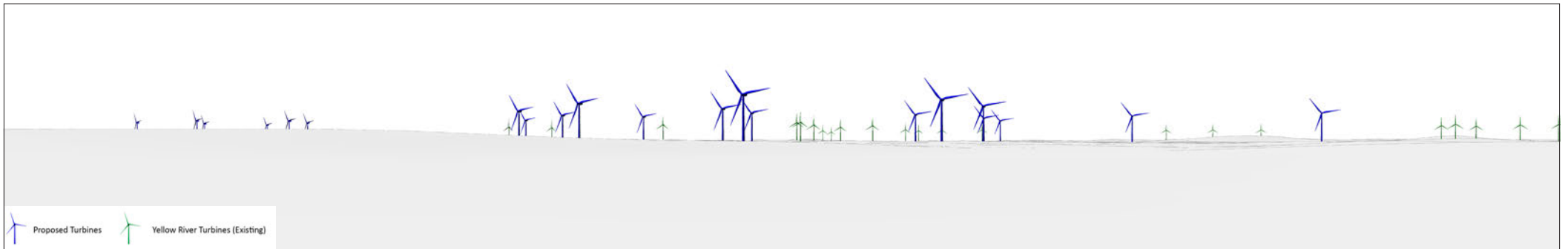

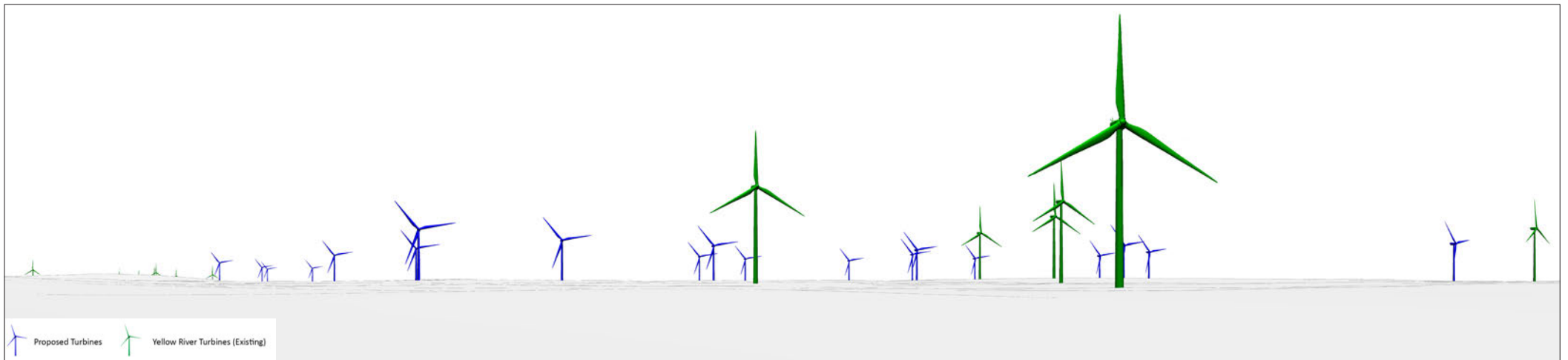
What is a photomontage?

A typical tool utilised in the assessment of the visual impact of a wind and solar project is a Photomontage. Photomontages are visualisations that superimpose an image of a proposed development upon a photograph or series of photographs and are used to illustrate the potential impact of a development on the existing landscape.

A number of photomontages will accompany the planning application as part of the Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA) for the proposed project. Within this booklet you will find samples of the photomontages which will form part of the LVIA for this proposed development. 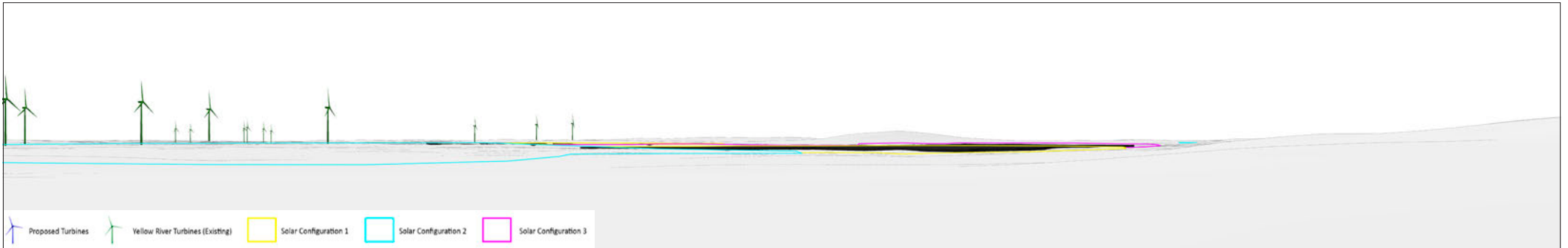

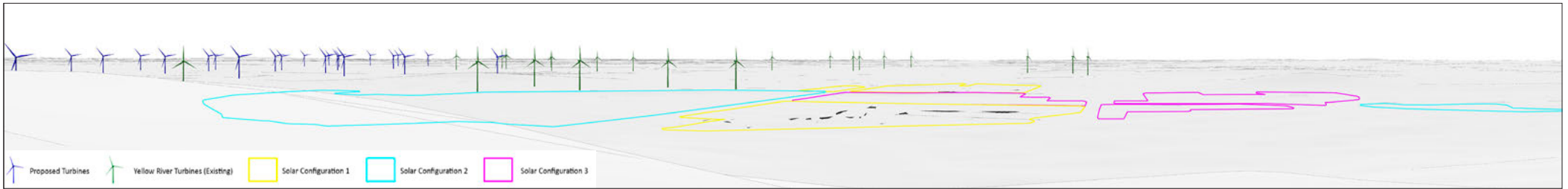
Viewpoint 3: View from local road L1009 at Corbertstown – approximately 1.5km east of the proposed development. **VP3** on Viewpoint Locations map.



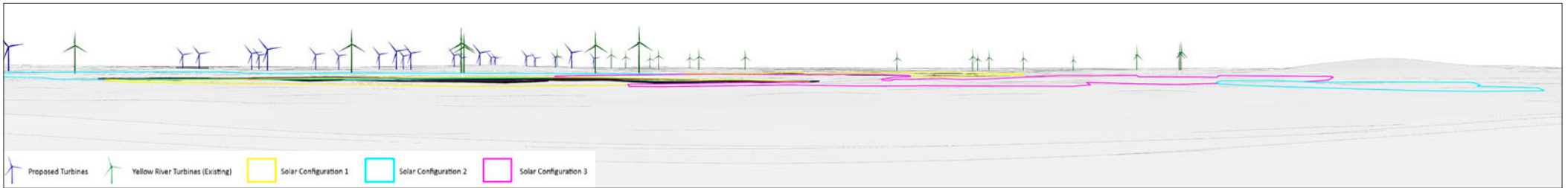
Viewpoint 4: View from local road at Knockdrin Hill – approximately 500m south of the proposed wind farm development. **VP4** on Viewpoint Locations map.
